Bharat Independence Day Parade - The Tiranga Yatra

Sewa Through the Year - Recurring Service Activities by the Central Jersey Chapter

"Sewa" a *Sanskrit* term that means "selfless service" or "voluntary service", is a concept found in various *Hindu* spiritual and philosophical traditions, emphasizing the idea of serving others without any expectation of personal gain or recognition. 'Sewa' is associated with acts of charity, kindness, and compassion towards those in need. In contemporary contexts, "Sewa" refers to various forms of community service, volunteering, or philanthropy aimed at helping individuals or communities facing challenges or hardships. "Sewa" is deeply rooted in the *Hindu* values of selflessness and empathy and is considered a virtuous and noble way to contribute to the betterment of society.

The Central Jersey Chapter has played a significant role in recurring "Sewa" activities in community engagement, social impact, and personal growth through the year and this month too, the service continues.

Educational & Fundraising Initiatives

Chapter LEADs have been planning and executing fund raising activities this summer to raise funds for multiple causes for Sewa International.

LEADs hosted a two-week Algebra camp for children in grades 7-9 where they were taught various topics in Algebra including linear equations, systems of equations, functions, exponents, and radicals. The fundraising from the camp was donated to the SAC and SHE programs.

Youth Engagement and Support Programs



Kiddie Keep Well Camp (KKWC) is a non-profit organization providing residential camping to under-resourced children in Middlesex County. Central Jersey Sewa LEADs volunteered at the camp in shifts, Monday through Friday throughout the summer. They helped with various activities including dicing vegetables for meals, setting up tables for breakfast, lunch and dinner as well as cleaning up the tables and neatly arranging the chairs and tables after each meal.

Healthcare Services:

LEADs helped the New York Blood Center with their blood drive at Metuchen YMCA where they assisted with checking in the registered donors and walk-ins. They also worked in the canteen, providing the donors with snacks, juice, and water to prevent fainting, lightheadedness, or reactions post giving blood. Chapter LEADs worked efficiently at the blood drive which is essential to maintaining the availability of safe and compatible blood for medical treatment, emergencies, and the well-being of individuals in the community and beyond.

LEADs also assisted at the NJ Health Camp, with free medical check-ups, consultations, and health education sessions for attendees. The primary focus was on promoting well-being, raising health awareness, and addressing the healthcare needs of marginalized populations within the local community.

Sustainable Agriculture, Biodiversity Conservation, and Environmental Services

With the summer almost coming to an end, the Chapter LEADs took advantage of the good weather and toiled to grow produce in their backyard – a service project the Chapter undertook since the previous year. LEADs continued to care for their vegetable garden which included chilies, tomatoes, cucumbers and other produce which were then donated to various food pantries.

LEADs also helped at Marlboro Community Garden, where they helped with pulling out weeds, filling up the compost bins and cleaning out the wood chips and at the Sri Guruvaayoorappan Temple Garden, LEADs helped in weeding and harvesting produce for the temple.

At the Watershed Institute's Butterfly Festival, the LEADs partook in a series of tasks, such as being doorman to the butterfly house - to make sure participants could enjoy the butterflies without allowing them to escape, serving lemonade as a refreshment to visitors, assisting in activities for the kids, and setting up the lawn games. Volunteers also assisted in the Arts and Crafts tent, placing tattoos on the attendees of the event. They also helped in collecting visitors' feedback on the event.

"Rows for the Hungry" embodies Sewa International's dedication to addressing food insecurity and community welfare. Through this initiative, volunteers engaged in cultivating various vegetables and fruits to provide sustenance for those in need.

As part of Chesterfield Township's initiative, Chapter LEADs have worked towards the Pet Census project where they worked to proactively connect with nearly **1,800** households to conduct the pet census. They have gone around to numerous households where they informed pet owners about pet registration rules and vaccination information.

At the Jewish Relief Agency, LEADs packed and delivered non-perishable food items as well as basic needs such as toilet paper to families in need.

LEADs helped stock shelves with food and hygiene products, as well as sorting and preparing fresh produce for distribution at the Franklin Food Bank through the month of August.

LEADs also volunteered at the Franklin Township Night Out, where they were able to intertwine community safety with effective fundraising.

LEADs have started service at the Sri Guruvaayoorappan Temple, where this month they helped in harvesting produce which are used to in the meals prepared for the Bhojanashala, to be served to the temple devotees.
