Sewa International Central Jersey Chapter's Annual Volunteer Appreciation & Award Ceremony

The Central New Jersey Chapter of Sewa International conducted their third Sewa Milan on Sunday, January 23, 2022. The 2-hour virtual event recognized the year-long efforts made by the Chapter's volunteers from the LEAD program, Family Services, Helpline, Disaster Relief teams, and honorees of the President's Volunteer Service Award for 2021. The high school volunteer participants of the LEAD (Leadership, Education, And Development) program collectively put in 32,000 hours of community service this past year.

Congressman Frank Pallone Jr., of the 6th Congressional District of NJ, was the Chief Guest at the event. The Guests Of Honor were Mr. Arthur Kapoor, Founder and CEO of HealthEC, and Dr. Suresh K. Jain, Board of Directors, Sewa International USA.

Volunteer Spotlight






Rekha Ravi, Family Service coordinator, went over the various critical cases that the chapter has handled, the assistance provided at FEMA vaccination sites both in and out of state, scheduling vaccination appointments for the elderly, and supporting partner organization MANAVI for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.

Sandesh Kamath, a joint coordinator of the Central Jersey Chapter, provided a summary of the LEAD program and all that was accomplished by the Chapter despite the constraints and limitations of Covid.

The 240+ attendees included dignitaries and leaders of many partner organizations from various townships including President Arun Kankani, Director of Programs & Project Prem Pusuloori, Vijay Mallampati, and Anita Kant attended the program from Sewa International.

Rev. Karen Hernandez-Granzen of Westminster Presbyterian Church, Trenton, NJ said, "You see the divine within you calling you to serve the divine in others. We are blessed to have you to serve hot meals to so many people in Trenton."

Pastor Cyndi Stouffer of United Methodist Church said, "Thank you from the bottom of our heart in all the ways you have helped our community to allow our ministry to serve so many lives, especially our friends living on the street. Just keep serving, our world desperately needs you."





The program started with a traditional Deep Prajwalan (lighting the lamp) ceremony followed by the national anthems of the US and India. The welcome to the guests was accompanied by a Sewa Geet presentation.

The LEADs themselves managed the entire event, including planning, emceeing, performing (instrumental music, dancing, and singing), presenting, and providing tech support. AttachAvi Autism foundation's young adults performed dances to appreciate Sewa's volunteer work at the foundation. Folk dances and the piano performance added a cultural touch to the program, and the quiz questions sprinkled throughout the event kept everyone engaged.

The program concluded with the Shanti Mantra (peace for the world prayer).

SACO Covid Testing Site Assistance

The South Asian Community Outreach (SACO) ran a free mega Covid testing site at Papiani Park in Edison, NJ. They further went on to assist with the data entry and in generating lab test orders for test samples. The goal was to execute a total 75 Crore (750,000,000) rounds of Surya Namaskar all over the world but the number has far surpassed the expectations!

India's ancient sages developed the Surya Namaskar as a unique combination of physical and spiritual activity. It is a 10-step combination of 8 poses, done with rhythmic breathing (Pranayama) and chanting Mantras. Besides being a great cardiovascular workout, Surya Namaskar is also known to have an immensely positive impact on the mind and body.

Our volunteers from Central Jersey Chapter participated in this great event and did around 1200 Surya Namaskars!
