What is the Youth for SEWA Board (YFS)?

- Board consists of committed high school students
- Responsible for planning and executing volunteer activities
- Meet on a weekly basis virtually and in-person monthly
- Students will conduct annual planning for YFS activities
- Connect with local organizations to execute activities
- Activities include annual Oratorical and Essay competition, 5K run, Highway Clean up, etc.



What is LEAD?

- A 10-month program (January October) to introduce socially conscious leadership principles to current 8th-11th grade students
- Provides a platform to serve the community with local volunteering projects
- Exposes students to community leaders and successful professionals to aid in network building



What to Expect as a LEAD Member

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- Required to participate in at least 1 volunteer opportunity in a month during the course of the program
- Required to attend monthly in-person meetings to learn about ongoing projects, volunteer opportunities and connecting with local community CEOs/leaders
- Opportunity to participate in the Speech and Essay competitions, 5K run and other Sewa DC activities
- Eligibility for the Presidential Volunteer Service Award
 - \circ $\;$ Students who attain 100 volunteer hours are eligible for this award
 - Participant needs to be a citizen or a permanent resident



Key Success Factors – LEAD program

• Student Commitment

- Students should demonstrate their desire to bring about societal change
- Demonstrate desire to participate and lead volunteering activities

• Parent Mentors

- We need **parent volunteers** with ability to guide the LEAD teams and ensure timely progress
- Communicate openly, and respect other volunteers, mentors, partners, and members of the society

Building Capacity and Engagement

- Participating students can **come back** next year as:
 - DTL participants or Mentors
 - Apply to YFS Board



What is Design To Lead (DTL)?

- Goal is to train Sewa's next generation of leaders in the **Design** Thinking methodology
- Students will learn to **identify** unmet social needs and **develop** potential solutions
- Sewa's impact on the community is taken to a deeper level

Design Thinking Adapted for DTL

- The five step process is aligned to three distinct phases -- Identify,
 Invent and Implement
- Student must commit to completing the Identify and Invent phase throughout the spring and summer
- They may choose continue with Implement phase in the **fall**



Past DTL Projects

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• Recent Projects Have Focused on:

- Seniors Living with Cancer
- Seniors Dealing with Hearing Loss
- High School Peers Dealing with Mental Health Issues during COVID-19 pandemic
- Local food insecurities
- Digital Divide in Underserved Communities
- Each group has to write a 3-5 page research paper and present their work at the end of the year
- Sewa adult mentors and experts, community stakeholders and advisors actively engaged

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Parent Mentors Roles & Responsibilities

DTL Parent Mentors

- Assist them with brainstorming the primary research ideas
- Ensure team cohesiveness, enable them to agree to team ground rules and meeting times
- Remind team members to stay on track
- Periodically review the team's progress

LEAD Parents Mentors

- Encourage kids to participate in volunteer activities
- Bring them to monthly meetings
- Build and support an household environment that values and promotes volunteerism
- Actively look for volunteer opportunities that LEADs can participate in
- Volunteer for SEWA to help with chapter programs
